Two (2) WBAOSC Foundation Scholarships of \$1,500 each may be awarded to deserving female law school students (accepted or currently attending) who were residents of Orange or Sullivan Counties, New York at the time of their graduation from high school or college.

AWARDS GIVEN: Two Scholarships of \$1500 may be awarded for qualified education

expenses of tuition, fees or course related expenses to two students from Orange and Sullivan Counties. The Rose S. Rosen Memorial Scholarship and Susan B. Keiser Memorial Scholarship (descriptions are on the last page of the attached application) are named after pioneering members of the Women's Bar Association of Orange and Sullivan Counties. Scholarship recipients also receive a free (1) year

WBAOSC membership if eligible.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS: Any female student, resident of Orange or Sullivan Counties, NY at

the time of graduation from high school or college, and currently attending, or accepted for admission in, law school (payable if school

is attended).

CRITERIA: Scholarships will be awarded to applicants who demonstrate

academic achievement, leadership and philanthropic potential, and a strong commitment to the profession, and/or the ability to overcome difficult obstacles. Involvement in programs that highlight advancement or support of women in the profession and in the community and participation in community outreach programs will also be considered. Previous recipients of a scholarship remain

eligible to reapply if otherwise meeting the criteria.

ROSE S. ROSEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The WBAOSC Foundation established this scholarship in 2009 in memory of Rose Rosen, a former President of the Women's Bar Association of Orange and Sullivan Counties and a pioneering woman in the law.

Rose Rosen served as a Founding Member of the Women's Bar Association of Orange and Sullivan Counties. When she graduated from St. John's Law School in New York in 1929, one of only about four women in her class, she was denied admission to the New York State bar because of gender. Not to be defeated, she ran her husband's (George H. Rosen) law practice in Sullivan County, persisted in seeking admission to the New York State Bar, and ultimately achieved her goal. She practiced many years under her maiden name. Rose Rosen passed away in 1989. We recognize that the pioneering spirit of Rose Rosen is still needed today to continue to provide avenues for the advancement and education of women lawyers in our society. Her example and unwavering commitment to the practice of law notwithstanding gender barriers inspired the WBAOSC Foundation to establish this scholarship.

SUSAN KEISER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The WBAOSC Foundation established this scholarship in 2009 in memory of Susan Keiser, a former President of the Women's Bar Association of Orange and Sullivan Counties and a committed volunteer to her community and the advancement of woman in the law.

Susan Keiser served as President of the Women's Bar Association of Orange and Sullivan Counties and was a State Treasurer of the Women's Bar Association of the State of New York. She was the recipient of the Rose Rosen Award given by WBAOSC in 1990. Her impact on her community and volunteer spirit was inspiring. Susan was a member of the Sullivan County Charter Commission and a Trustee of the Sullivan County Community College. She was a founder of the Sullivan County Youth Council and Planned Parenthood of Sullivan County, a member of the board of Congregation Agudas Achim of Livingston Manor, and a founder of both the Sullivan County Scenic Coalition and Project Manor. Her devotion to the law and advancement of women lawyers was evidenced by her life choices. Susan became a lawyer through apprenticeship in her husband, Michael's law office and took and passed the N.Y.S. Bar Exam in 1977 without having attending law school. From 1978, she practiced law at Keiser & Keiser. She received a B.A. from the University of Chicago, an M.A. from New York University and a PhD from the Fielding Graduate Institute. Susan was a candidate for Family Court Judge of Sullivan County in 1992, losing election by just 76 votes of 29,000 cast. The WBAOSC Foundation established this scholarship in recognition of her tireless community service and undaunting example of commitment to the promotion of women in the law.
