



LL.M DRA Program
Writing Requirement Form

LL.M students who are in the DRA degree program must complete a writing requirement that is a **minimum of 20 pp on a DRA topic** which receives a grade of “B” or better. This requirement is described in both the LL.M. Curriculum Guide and the Student Handbook, which students should review.

Students must plan **in advance** how they will complete this assignment, and make sure that they have discussed this with whichever professor will be reviewing and grading this writing requirement. In addition, this form must be completed in order to verify that the writing requirement has been satisfied. There are **TWO PARTS** to this form:

Part A is to be completed once the student has decided how they will satisfy the writing requirement. For students graduating in January, Part A must be completed, signed, and submitted to the Graduate and International Programs Office no later than October 1st. For students graduating in June/September, Part A must be completed, signed, and submitted to the Graduate and International Programs Office no later than March 1st.

Part B is to be completed by the professor who has supervised and graded the writing requirement, and must be submitted to the Graduate and International Programs Office AND the Registrar’s Office by the last date of final exams for the semester the student is graduating.
