Submission Opportunity for DRA LL.M. Students

The Kukin Program for Conflict Resolution at the Cardozo School of Law is pleased to offer Dispute Resolution and Advocacy LL.M. students the opportunity to have their work featured in the *Cardozo Journal of Conflict Resolution* (“CJCR”). Eligible students¹ may submit their writing requirement for the DRA LL.M. program for consideration.² Below are the requirements and guidelines:

Submission Requirements

1. Length: Minimum of 25 pages and a maximum of 45 pages (double-spaced, Times New Roman Font Size 12, 1-inch margins).
2. Citations³: The paper must include at least 150 footnotes, formatted in accordance with the *Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation* (21st edition, 2020).
3. Deadline: Papers must be submitted by May 15, 2025 to be considered for publication.

Selection and Publication

- The CJCR Executive and Editorial Board will select papers to be published in Volume 27 (2025–2026 Volume).
- If selected for publication, the author must confirm their consent for the paper to appear in one issue of Volume 27 of CJCR (2025–2026 Volume).
- Submission does not guarantee publication.

Author Obligations

1. Collaboration: The author agrees to work with the CJCR Executive and Editorial Boards to prepare the article for publication. This includes:
 - Reviewing final edits proposed by the editorial board.
 - Accepting or denying changes as appropriate.
 - Permitting modifications consistent with publication standards.
2. Original Work: The author must affirm that the submission is their original work.

¹ An eligible student means a student currently enrolled in, or recently graduated from, the LL.M. in Dispute Resolution and Advocacy (DRA) program at the Cardozo School of Law.

² Please note that this opportunity is separate from your writing submission requirement from the DRA LL.M. program of Cardozo School of Law. You will not receive any academic or writing credit for your paper as part of your submission to CJCR.
